



OFFICE OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL DEPARTMENT OF THE NAVY

The Department of the Navy's Office of the General Counsel (OGC) consists of approximately 613 civilian attorneys plus 30 uniformed Navy and Marine Corps Judge Advocates, with approximately 306 located in the Washington, D.C. area and others in 95 field offices throughout the country and abroad. It is separate in both organization and practice from the uniformed Navy's Judge Advocate General's Corps and the Marine Corps Judge Advocates. The General Counsel of the Navy is the principal legal advisor to the Secretary of the Navy, and OGC attorneys assist the General Counsel in providing legal services to the Secretary, his staff, and personnel throughout the Navy and the Marine Corps. OGC includes approximately 50 intellectual property attorneys who are admitted to practice before the United States Patent and Trademark Office.

The legal work of OGC is sophisticated as well as varied. A principal area of OGC's practice is Government contract law, which is similar in nature to a business and commercial law practice. Additionally, OGC attorneys work in areas such as litigation, intellectual property law, fiscal law, real estate law, utilities law, environmental law, admiralty and maritime law, labor law, ethics law and civilian personnel law.



OGC encourages its attorneys to gain a variety of legal experience by working in different parts of the organization and promotes and rewards each attorney as rapidly as his/her performance and professional development merits. New attorneys are assigned clients and cases almost from their first day at work. Accordingly, OGC seeks the best-qualified attorneys and law students. OGC hires approximately 6 to 10 summer law clerks each year from law students who have completed at least two years of legal studies and makes advance commitments to approximately 5 to 8 graduating law students. OGC hires experienced attorneys as well. The complexity of the legal work and the responsibility involved permits OGC to hire beginning attorneys at the GS-11 level, with promotion potential to GS-15 as well as to the Senior Executive Service.



Navy OGC welcomes applications from both law students and practicing attorneys.
